He's writing a piece on the Hidden Hunger initiative in next week's edition. Principal's Report

In April, staffing is projected for the following school year; the board is currently projecting 370 students for fall 2019. Jockvale will be reduced by one class, the congregated gifted class. There will be 16 homerooms with the majority of the classes being split. Vacancy lists are currently out for teachers to apply.

There will be a school climate survey on May 2nd and 3rd.

Education week is coming up quickly. Lots planned including the musical We Are Monsters, a potluck breakfast with an art display (themes of monsters and spring), the ukulele club is performing, class visits, the cake walk on Friday and track and field. It's going to be a very busy week.

EQAO preparations are underway for assessments to take place from May 22nd-May 31st.

Sad news was received today that Beverly McConnell, Jockvale's Library Technician passed away; she will be greatly missed by the Jockvale community and our thoughts go out to her family and friends.

Teacher's Report

Students behaved exceptionally during the unexpected field trip to John McCrae and she was proud to be part of Jockvale.

The spring baskets are out in the hall, and everyone is getting excited. So many clubs and intramurals happening currently and it's a very busy time of year. Hopefully everyone will come to spend time together on the morning of the breakfast.



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Treasurer's Report

The current adjusted school council balance (including the float) is \$24987.91. The payments for School Cash online for March haven't been added yet.

The total cash available is \$14066.07.

In the Profit Report, there is still one more payment due to Budding Artists which is why the profit from that fundraiser looks higher than it actually is.

OCASC Report

This month's meeting was a small group but enough for quorum. There were still many questions to answer about risk management; the OCDSB rep was asked about trips and more transparency and clear guidelines were requested (ie. What trips will be cancelled, what happens to legacy trips, etc.). This topic will also come up at the next PIC meeting.

There was a presentation from Mylifeonline.com. Their demographic is grades 4-8 and they focus on the benefits and risks of social media. There are 3 styles of presentation to choose from including in person and live stream and seems geared more towards younger students than presentations that Jockvale's had in the past. The big takeaway is that parents need to have open conversations with their children and build a child's social media together. 50% of students regret posting something on-line and what you post can impact your future; many employers now check out the social media of potential hires.

A lot of schools are still trying to get 3D printers (we are lucky to have one at Jockvale). The goal is to have one at every school.

Insurance information; is there a checklist of requirements for insurance policy? Phil will look into this and get the info to Krista.

Legacy trips; many of these have gone by the wayside as they are too much to spend on one trip and many families can't afford it. Trips need to allow for an equal opportunity for all students.

Fundraising Report

Current Fundraisers

- There were 64 Artrageous orders placed and \$713 was earned. This would be a good fundraiser to run in November of next year since many people would purchase items as holiday gifts.



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- Vesey's Bulbs raised \$1184 and orders can be expected to come in during the month of May.
- Boston Pizza night was a lot of fun. Thank you to all of the staff that helped out! \$383.25 was earned which is a smaller profit considering the amount of work that staff do at the event. It may not be worth doing another year even though it was a good way to bring the school community together and all of the staff and families enjoyed it.
- Students ordered 78 cases of chocolate bars, but council bumped up the order to 100 cases in case anyone sells their first case and wants a second. There is a potential profit of \$3276 for the 78 cases that have been accounted for. A suggestion was put forth about the timing of chocolate bar sales since this is a busy time for fundraisers; could it be moved to another time of year?

Upcoming Events

- The Games dance is this Friday and volunteers are still needed. The lack of volunteers is becoming an issue for many events and it seems to be the same parents every time...how can we recruit more volunteers in the future? Could some events be in jeopardy if we don't have people to fill the shifts?
- Trivia Night is scheduled for May 14th at 7:00pm.
- Spring Fling is coming up in June and 3 food trucks have been booked. There will also be an obstacle course.

It looks like snacks are disappearing from the council kitchen (chocolate bars, bags of chips, Welch's fruit snacks). They have been moved to another location, but a lock may need to be purchased in the future if it continues.

Record of Decision - April 8th, 2019 (by e-mail)

In order to meet the deadline for the newsletter, a decision needed to be made on April 8th regarding the funds raised through the upcoming chocolate bar sale. The following motion was made....

Motion: "I'd like to motion that the funds raised from chocolate bar sales go directly to a shade structure, size to be determined." 1st Debbie Hameluck, 2nd Kelly Stanzel. 8 votes in favour, 2 abstentions. Passed.

Dates for gym reservation (2019/2020)

Council can book the gym for 6 events total and need to select the dates now. These are the proposed dates and events...

September 27th – Movie Night October 25th – Hallowe'en Dance November 29 - Movie Night (historically the 1st week of December is usually a good time for this movie night but this past year wasn't as successful). Feb 7th – Movie Night April 3rd – Movie Night



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May 1st – Dance June 10th – Spring Fling

A concern was raised regarding the amount of events in May since Education Week always falls that month. It feels like there have been a lot of events happening lately and this could be why turnout may not be as high at the Games Dance this month. Because of this, one of the movie nights was moved to September and it was suggested that this movie night could be combined with Meet the Teacher.

PRO Grant

There isn't any information yet on whether or not this will be offered next year. Normally applications are available at this point, but as of now the application process is not open. We need to plan ahead and book this event in advance and usually it's voted on by the June meeting. Phil will follow up with OCASC to see if anyone else has information. This item will be moved to next month's agenda and a decision will be made then.

Shade structure/outdoor feature update

The committee has not met yet, but are tentatively setting something up for next month. They are still trying to get information on guidelines and restrictions, but 4 approved locations have been shared. Hopefully we can get a plan in motion so there is a fundraising goal to work towards.

The tables with benches seemed like a good option to Josh Rebertz's boss (he's seen several options and thinks the kids would use this one since it has seats and tables). Should the teachers be polled to get feedback on what they think will be used the most by students?

Trillium Grant – in order to apply for this grant, a plan is needed and the money must be used within a year so this application will be deferred for now. Once the build date is closer, we can apply.

Any Other Business

The missed pizza day (that fell on the snow day) will be rescheduled in May. Willy's did not end up charging council for the dough on the cancelled day.

Motion for Allocation of Funds

Motion: To allocate \$600 to purchase gift cards for the supplies for the food bowls. This will be divided as follows: \$400 to Costco, \$100 to Loblaws, and \$100 to Independent. 1st Krista MacIsaac, 2nd Kelly Stanzel. All in favour. Passed.

Motion: To allocate up to \$550 to purchase 10 plastic folding tables to be used at events (the school can use these as well). 1st Krista MacIsaac, 2nd Kelly Stanzel. All in favour. Passed.



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Motion: To allocate \$300 for May movie night. 1st Krista MacIsaac, 2nd Shannon McLaren. All in favour. Passed.

Staffing Updates

On April 29th, Margaret Murphy, Educational Assistant, returns to Jockvale after an extended parental leave. She will be working with the students in Room 18, 21 and 22.

School Organization for 2019-2020

April has been about staffing and projections for the 2019-2020 school-year. Our projected enrollment is 370 students. Next year, we will have sixteen homeroom classes. We have been reduced by one class, our Congregated Gifted class, as all of our current gifted students will be moving on to Middle School.

OCDSB School Climate Survey for Students

The OCDSB is committed to creating inclusive, safe and caring environments. As part of this commitment, along with direction from the Ministry, OCDSB schools administer school climate surveys to students every two years. The purpose of a school climate survey is to better understand students' perceptions about bullying, safety at school, and student engagement. We know that when students feel safe and welcomed at school that they are more likely to achieve at higher levels and have a stronger sense of well-being.

On this survey, students are asked to answer questions related to school climate and safety, bullying, the perception of the school, sense of belonging, and their background, including age, gender, and grade. The data from this survey will be used to help us develop strategies to prevent bullying and to promote safe and inclusive schools.

Jaguars who are in grades four to six will complete the online anonymous OurSCHOOL Survey on **May 2nd** and **May 3rd, 2019**. Parents who do not want their child(ren) to complete the survey must advise the school in writing.

Appendix C – OCASC Report

The OCASC meeting was held on the 18th of April. There was a printout of the powerpoint slideshow panels that I forwarded to the council drive from the OCDSB Risk Management Group.

The meetings had a quick discussion in regards to the prior risk management presentation and unofficially was stated the following in regards to class/school trips:

Day trips: principal's approval Overnight trip: superintendent's approval International trip: associate director's approval

There was a discussion in how to measure the requirement that trips needed to contain 'higher educational learning' because it was too subjective. Everyone pretty much agreed that it such a

statement would be understood as receiving learning/experience that couldn't been obtained through the classroom or school location (ie. nature learning – wild bird feeding and habitat.)

The OCASC representative from Mutchmor presented a motion for OCASC at the PIC meeting to request transparency and clear guidelines as to what trips can be cancelled and to quantify 'legacy trips' that are cancelled. This would allow parents to understand and prepare for what they year would have/not have in the upcoming school year.

Due to public outcry, there will be a second round of consultation in regards to the class room sizes and parents are being advised to engage local MPP in the next two months to push what they opinion is for their children's education.

We then had an interactive webinar with Dave and Blake who were the founders of MyLifeOnline. They illustrated what their company does to assist our children as well as parents to better prepare them for the surge of social media and proven statistics. The target demographic is for Grade 4 to 8. It was stated that every child, teacher, and parent are different. The biggest thing is the attitude and misunderstanding surrounding Social Media and they explained everything in a manner that many could easily understand.
