Principal's Report to School Council- December 1, 2021

**REMEMBRANCE DAY-** On November 11th, all classes joined in to the link provided by the OCDSB for the District's Remembrance Day Virtual Ceremony to honour those who have served and those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms we have. The ceremony included a land acknowledgement from an Indigenous leader, addresses from Chair of the Board Trustee Lynn Scott and Director Camille Williams Taylor, as well as presentations from various students from across the district.

We would like to thank the Jockvale community for their generous contributions to the purchase of the wreath and poppy donations to the Legion through School Cash Online. JES made a donation in the amount of \$162.00 to the Legion after paying for the wreath.

#### **BULLYING AWARENESS AND PREVENTION WEEK**

- The Positivity Patrol visited Jockvale to kick start the week. They left POSITIVE POST ITs on the desks of all students.
- We discussed bullying on the announcements. Students were provided with different scenarios each morning. They needed to determine if it was indeed bullying behaviour or unkind and unexpected behaviour.
- Our Junior students had the opportunity to participate in a virtual assembly with Saidat. Students were reminded of their social responsibilities and that they are in charge of making good choices. Saidat reinforced the message that all students in the classroom have the right to feel valued, supported and appreciated for their similarities and differences and that kindness sets off a chain reaction. Our Primary students have been provided with a video series that reinforces these messages in shorter chunks of time.

**CUBBIES and LOCKERS-** The District has allowed us to use cubbies, hooks and lockers if we are able to ensure adequate social distancing in our hallways. Unfortunately, we do not have enough cubbies, hooks and lockers for everyone given these parameters. To ensure that we are able to be as equitable as possible, each classroom will design a system allowing students some access (whether on a rotation basis per cohort or allowing a spot for everyone to place their wet boots to keep the classroom floors clean). While these spaces have been made accessible, students must continue to bring all of their personal belongings (sweaters, lunch bags, water bottles) home each night to ensure that the best possible cleaning job can occur each evening.

**JAG SWAG-** School Spiritwear has arrived for those who opted for a school drop off. It has been distributed to students/parents.

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
#### STAFF LEARNING

- Class Land Acknowledgements- several of our classes have completed Land Acknowledgements. They have truly done a fantastic job working through the process involved in creating these reflective commitments. We rotate through them to start our day each morning.
- Learning Skills and Equity- Part of our learning as educators has been to peel back the layers of our practice and to reflect on our own conscious and unconscious biases. This month, we will begin to look at the connection between Learning Skills and academic achievement. Research from the TDSB has shown that for many marginalized students, their learning skills do not align with their academic achievement- which leaves us with the question: How do we define excellence in Learning Skills? Whose definition of excellence are students being held to and are those objective measures or subjective? We will then look more closely at those measures for our own students and continue the conversation around equitable assessment practices.
- ❖ DIBELS Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills We have conducted the first subtest of the District-approved literacy formative assessment (DIBELS) with our kindergarten and grade one students. We conducted the Letter Naming Fluency (LNF) test which requires students to name upper and lower case letters of the alphabet. The LNF may be used as an indicator of future risk as to who may require additional instructional support with Basic Early Literacy Skills. We will be using DIBELS mid year and at the end of the year as well.
