Meeting called to order at 7:02pm Welcome and Land Acknowledgement

#### Approval of Agenda

Motion: To accept the agenda. 1st Elise Currie, 2nd Krista MacIsaac. All in favour. Passed.

### Approval of Previous Minutes

**Motion:** To approve the minutes. 1<sup>st</sup> Krista MacIsaac, 2<sup>nd</sup> Crystal Logan. All in favour. Passed.

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#### Chair's Report

Shannon reviewed Annual Report (see Appendix A).

Discussed priorities from last year included continuing the Fight Hidden Hunger program and supporting the school for items and programming to make things easier through a COVID year. Fundraising was minimal.

Shannon gave a thank you to council and invited comments on the Annual Report.

Shannon informed council that a decision was made prior to meeting to allocate \$100 for setting up kit for 4<sup>th</sup> kindergarten class.

Continued with introductions.

#### Principal's Report

Robyn thanked council and parents for support through start of school year.

Robyn reported on class size numbers (listed in Principal's Report).

New information that there is a request by a student for a Service Dog to be used. The application is in process and information form will be sent home to parents as well as an email to parents.

Although formal reporting of daily COVID screening will be ending, it is still expected that parents complete screener daily – just do not need to submit.

Orange Shirt Day – Day for Truth and Reconciliation – plans are in place for various activities, teachers will be planning age-appropriate activities and conversations in each class. There will be a ribbon tying ceremony, collaborative art, and an assembly presented by Q Mack.

FPIES – there is a new family to the school with some severe food allergies. The students with the syndrome are particularly reactive to popcorn. Jockvale has become a Popcorn Free school. The family has stated that if popcorn will be sold at movie night, they will opt out. Council discussed that if events can be held, then can discuss an alternative to popcorn in order to be inclusive to all.

Question from Crystal around return of loaned out technology from last year. Loretta reported that most Chromebooks were returned to the school. Some needed to be culled as they were

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discontinued. Question whether students continuing in OCV this year have access to a different pool of tech – this is the case. Loretta will share info about Chromebook numbers once they are finalized.

#### Teacher's Report

Penny has volunteered to be the teacher rep again this year.

She reported that students have started the year already knowing the routines. Need to do some work on co-operative play, skills that were missed last year.

Council inquired if the students have access to equipment during recess and if there is any equipment needed. Report from Penny and Robyn that teachers are responsible for their own bag of outdoor eqt and then the sanitization of it when it comes back inside. This means that different classes have different access to equipment depending on the routine of the teacher.

It is anticipated that likely to continue at least into October that parents will not be allowed into building.

### Treasurer's Report

The attached report reflects deposits since last report. Opening Balance was \$22 578.45 – see notes on report. Closing Balance was \$15 824.32 which matches the balance listed on the report (and in account).

Cash available is \$3183.98 as the remaining amount from Closing Balance has been allocated to other items.

Krista will adjust report to reflect that Scientist in School will be updated to be listed as a future event for 2021/2022.

Brenda reported that she has not yet opened the School Cash Online option for Food Task Force. She can do this as per direction from Council when needed.

**Communications Chair** – Krista MacIsaac nominated Jennifer Demone, and Jennifer Stacey also volunteered. **Jennifer Stacey** acclaimed as Jennifer Demone chose to step down from position.

**Volunteer Coordinator** – **Jennifer Demone** volunteered for this position if it is required this year.

**Parent Members at Large** – all other parent members present agreed to sit on Council as Members at Large.

#### Discussion of Priorities for 2021/2022

Suggestion of a Dance-a-thon – students doing the dancing in class. Suggestion of the seed fundraiser – Shannon will take this one. Suggestion of Panago fundraiser. Can also discuss FundScript again.

#### Food Task Force

Funds were allocated last year so some were used to replenish snack kits.

Brenda will inform Council when more are needed.

#### **Any Other Business**

Dear Parents and Jockvale Community,

Welcome back! We hope that you had a safe and enjoyable summer, given everything going on in the world! Last school year was a challenging one for JESC given the pandemic and number of weeks that were spent in virtual school mode. Despite this, our council should be proud of our accomplishments given the difficulty in fundraising, and look forward to what we can do to continue to support our school in this new way of doing things, as we continue in pandemic mode into 2021/2022.

The role of school council is to enrich the student educational experience, to enhance accountability of the education system to parents, and to serve an advisory role to the school administration. During the 2020/21 school year, we advised the administration on the following topics:

- Fight Hidden Hunger: This program was launched in the 2018/2019 school year and has been successful at providing students with snacks throughout the day in a way that is designed to eliminate stigma. While initially provided as a snack bowl of fruit, with supplementary food available from the school office, we had to rethink this to minimize mixing of cohorts, touching of open food, and how to address keeping healthy food in the class that was non-perishable. In 2020/2021 the school council provide snack bags consisting of a nutrigrain bar and a squeeze apple sauce to provide snacks to any hungry student.
- Fundraising priorities: Early in the school year, the council agreed to focus on two key things: anything that would help with the current pandemic school reality (e.g. painting of lines in the school yard) and keeping the snack backs available in the classrooms.
- Communication: Council worked closely with administration to ensure an effective communication strategy beginning with helping to provide input into the instructions out to parents at the start of the year.
   Information is shared through emails from the school, our Facebook page and Group, as well as some
  newsletters throughout the year.

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#### **Fundraising:**

The 2020/2021 year was a lean year for fundraising due to the pandemic: we wanted to keep fundraising to low-touch options, and agreed we did not want to run any programs when school was in virtual mode. Additionally, we were constrained as we could not run food programs, or events, which are typically the two largest sources of revenue for the council. Despite this, we ran:

- McDonald's Night
- Boston Pizza Night
- Open Donation to the Fight Hidden Hunger Task Force throughout the year over School Cash online.

For a full report on fundraising activities, please see appendix A (Financial Report).

These and other fundraisers allowed us to fund:

- Snack Bags in every classroom
- Holiday hampers for families in need
- Painting and marking of the school field to assist in cohorting
- Increasing available lamination supplies for the school, to allow easy-wiping in alignment with cleansing quidelines
- Virtual assemblies for anti-bullying
- T-Shirts and a virtual Escape Room for Year End Graduation celebrations for outgoing Grade 6 students

We wish the best of luck to all of the candidates in the 2021/2022 JESC elections at our AGM. Issues that we anticipate to be relevant for the incoming council include:

- The ongoing role of council in this "new normal". Pandemic rules and guidelines will continue to limit or eliminate that many activities that we would normally do throughout the school year. The new council will need to be creative in everything they do and should consider the following priorities:
  - New fundraising initiatives that limit contact.
  - Building community when we all have to be apart.

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- Maintaining the snack program.
- Larger items such as the Shade Structure will likely need to be delayed until things get back to normal.

We would like to thank Shannon and Crystal for reviewing our Return to School Plan for parents and providing us with feedback to improve our communication as we prepared for re-entry.


We would like to thank Council for the donation of individual snack packages. They are once again a hit. Our students are greatly benefiting from the additional food as they readjust to the regular school day.

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**THE THIRD PATH-** This year, Jockvale formally walks *The <u>Third Path</u>* - where academics and well-being are the unified pathway for our students and staff. *The Third Path* is a relationship-based approach that will play a critical role in our School Learning Plan and our school community.

There are eight conditions for achievement and well-being that support human development. The first condition outlined in *The Third Path* – Safety – is so critical when establishing a relationship-based approach to learning. The authors (Dr David Tranter, Lori Carson, Tom Boland) refer to the 'feeling of being safe' as the most basic condition that needs to be met in order for students to be able to engage in learning.

We will include snippets of our learning with our school community in our FRIDAY messages.

**WELCOME BACK ASSEMBLY-** Ms Dupuis and I hosted a virtual assembly on the first FRIDAY of the school year where we introduced our staff (via photograph) sans mask and reviewed COVID safe expectations. We also shared an interactive read aloud called *We Are Water Protectors* by Carole Linstrom. It is a beautiful exploration of the values, connections and wisdom of Indigenous people as it relates to water and Mother Earth. It was inspired by the many Indigenous led movements in North America to protect water as a sacred source of and for life. This read aloud is part of our ongoing commitment to honouring the OCDSB Equity Roadmap. This fall, all of our classes will begin to create Land Acknowledgements that are meaningful to the individual classroom community. We look forward to including them as part of our land acknowledgement each morning and in upcoming communications.

**ORANGE SHIRT DAY-** Jockvale will be honouring the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Day (Orange Shirt Day) on September 30th in several ways.

- → Teachers will be programming age-appropriate lessons, activities, and discussions with their classes. Please feel free to ask your child(ren)'s teacher about their program.
- → We will be installing an "Every Child Matters" flag on a flagpole in the front foyer.
- → All students will be provided with pieces of orange ribbon to tie to the front kindergarten gate and along the back fence of the yard. The intent is to visually represent the significance of Orange Shirt Day with the school community.
- → We will be creating a collaborative school-wide temporary mural for a newly cleared space in our Library. All students and staff will contribute to the mural, which will be mounted on the



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wall the week of September 30th. This Library space will be the site for a rotation of collaborative art projects as we continue to engage in our school and district's equity and inclusivity work.

→ Students and staff will participate in <u>The Virtual Orange Shirt Assembly</u> hosted by Canada's only First Nation NBA All-Star Entertainer, Q-MACK, on September 30th.

**MEET THE STAFF-** Jockvale's "Meet the Staff" gatherings will be happening virtually on September 29th, 2021. Teachers will conduct virtual tours and/or group meetings with their students' parents and guardians. Teachers will share their meeting plans and links via email and their Google Classrooms or Google Sites, and they will offer more than one meeting time to avoid conflicts when there are siblings also attending the school. The intent of the online gatherings is to introduce parents and guardians to the staff members who work with your child(ren), to become familiar with the teacher's program, and to gain greater insight into what a day in the life of your child(ren) looks like. If parents/guardians have specific questions regarding their child(ren), please contact the teacher directly via phone or email.

**TERRY FOX RUN-** Terry Fox represented the best that Canadians have to offer. He was an example of courage, humility, determination, and perseverance. From a young age he exemplified these attributes that made him an inspiration for not only Canada, but the entire world. Our next generation of students will be the ones to continue Terry's fight and lead this worthy cause towards his dream of a world without cancer. Jockvale students will be participating in the Terry Fox Run again this year! Each class will either walk or run during their Phys Ed classes. If they have all permission forms in, they may elect to walk the path to the park. We will also hang red ribbons in his honour.

**ROWAN's LAW-** In 2018, the Ontario Legislature passed legislation designating the last Wednesday of each September as Rowan's Law Day. The day is dedicated to promoting awareness of strategies to prevent, identify, and manage concussions. Rowan Stringer was an OCDSB student. The OCDSB is committed to honouring her memory by ensuring that students in the District have an opportunity to learn about concussions so that they can keep themselves and others safe. Our students will learn about head injuries in Health class and we will hang blue ribbons in her honour.

**POPCORN-** We have three students attending Jockvale with severe allergies to popcorn. Therefore, Jockvale is now a popcorn free zone. Parents have stated that if movie nights resume, they will forego attending so that Council may sell popcorn in the evenings.

**FROM THE LIBRARY-** The Adopt a School program has got off to a great start. Indigo Barrhaven is raising money on our behalf and in the first week nearly \$1000 has been raised.

The first week of the used book drive resulted in a large box of gently used books being

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donated to us as well. Below is a picture of Sue Matthews and Michelle Brander with the donated books. The book drive will continue for two more Sunday afternoons.

This Saturday will be a Characters for a Cause day where Indigo's staff will be dressed as their favourite character with lots of fun activities (including a silent auction) taking place in the store. Thanks to the parent and staff volunteers who have agreed to help with the book drives.

Also pictured are some of the top picks from Jockvale students which were greatly enjoyed by children shopping in the store.

The Bookmobile program will begin this week. Ms Matthews will be visiting classes to distribute books to keep our students reading while the library is closed due to COVID restrictions.



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



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
