February Frenzy will end with March Madness Friday. Looking at a week long of activities – outlined in report. Different themed day each day. Scavenger hunt – M. Meilleur has helped create a leadership team of Grade 6 students who are volunteering to help. Have booked Luv 2 Groove to work with all of the classes. Also made themselves available to work with families. School wide activity will be baking. All classes will have the opportunity to bake, choose a recipe. Will the have a bake sale on the Friday. School wide activities also planned.

Family Night to finish off on March 3rd with Luv 2 Groove, curling in the gym, bingo, crafts, bake sale.

Forest of Reading continuing after the book fair week. Ongoing until May.

Treasurer's Report

This month took in a few deposits from Tru Earth, Movie Night, Sipology. Costs this month were the pizza for movie night and concession expenses. Looking at items that need to be reallocated – yard painting, makerspace, and post Covid social event (reallocate to Spring Fling).

Also need to set aside categories within the account/department. Kate has put forward a few categories that could be proposed – Outdoor Enhancements, Food Programs, STEM supplies/activities, Fundraiser – events, Fundraiser – space making. Will have to allocate an amount of \$470.72 to cover movie night expenses.

Teachers Report

Penny reports that the primary French teachers (gr 1-3) are all doing the same program vis a vis The Science of Reading – term emerging – a research based approach involves developmental psychology and neuroscience, teaching has to be taught explicitly and systematically. It's a Phonics/phoneme based program. Teaching the sounds with actions – same across the 3 grades. All grades playing the same type of games so it is consistent across the classes.

OCASC Report

Some notes from January's meeting:

-OSTA wants to speak to OCASC about their drive yellow campaign. Certain ppl from OCASC will attend and bring back the information

Report from Committee of the whole:

- Jewish education FTE
- OCDSB Strategic plan There's a "strategic plan kit" that can be brought to our school council including a form that can be completed as a group. Can do a one-on-one with superintendent, etc if more input is requested



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Report from Parent Involvement Committee:

- There was a presentation from the education foundation at the last PIC meeting (education foundation supports OCDSB schools to support families and reduce barriers through access to clothing, food, bursaries, provide school supplies, used to have autism swim classes)
- -Next meeting is Feb 22 and there will be a presentation on mental health
- -PIC provided input on strategic plan main focus on student achievement, support of parents and equity as well as after school resources, consistency, communications, etc
- -FACE Family and community engagement report School council professional development training sessions
- School Council Professional Development Sessions February 8th Keynote speakers working with admin, school gardens, recruiting a diverse school council. Theme is creating a sense of belonging in school councils. There's a save the date on the OCDSB website but no further information yet

PRO Grants - discussion about having volunteers, not necessarily from each school, write the Grant applications. Someone from OCASC has offered to lead this

SEAC (special education) report - Lack of EAs was discussed (lack if EAs available to hire)

Other discussion:

- Question about how to collect funds for school council "Hot lunches", bambora, School cash online were mentioned
- Glashan was asking about how to allow teachers to take students to nearby parks without needing to meet the adult-student ratios required for field trips, since they rely on city parks for green space
- Someone from Cairine Wilson SS mentioned frequent Wifi issues impacting students. They are looking for our input on whether this is a problem that we experience regularly... eg: what our are general tech issues (dropages, etc)

Council discussion to consider paying the OCASC fee – allocate up to \$50

Any Other Business

Brenda reporting that the school is at 450 kids – they had anticipated 350 for this school year and are registered at 450 right now.

Events – Movie Night was a success. They had to replenish the concession items. School still looking into the DVD player.



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March Madness Family Fun Night – had talked about trying to use the space. Using Gym – potentially doing half curling and half Omnikron and then do one session of Luv 2 Groove. Looking at ideas for a craft event and scavenger hunt. Still in planning about bake sale. Crystal wants to put out a questionnaire. Getting a poster ready. Thinking about wanting to get more parent volunteers. Recognizing the benefit of student volunteers but also feeling it is also beneficial to have parent volunteers. Jockvalevolunteers@gmail.com Discussion about putting it on poster, can be posted on Facebook and then in weekly teacher and principal messages. Brianne has got a few requests from community members who are not parents at the school. There are questions about Police Records Checks (PRC).

Loretta reports that there is a process for within the school – there is a volunteer form to fill out. There is not always a need for a PRC and would not be required in that context.

Fundraising Updates:

Flip Give – still making money on it but in very small increments – is there a benefit to advertising it.

Tru Earth – occasionally putting it in the Facebook page and in occasional Friday message

Purdy's – Krista has signed up for Purdy's – has a delivery window of March 28 – April 2nd. Can consider pick up Wednesday and at school. Orders are due by March 15, 2023. Every is directly on the online store. Updated poster from last year. Fundraiser is open now. Discussion around how to promote – via paper or via digital. Will try a combination of both.

Discussion to promote the Purdy's Fundraiser as a fundraiser towards Spring Fling – council in agreement.

Make it Sow – not signed up to our knowledge.

Memorial for Robyn – question from Krista – can current money be used for a memorial or does it have to be specifically collected for a memorial fund? Questions around ability to pay for a memorial – does it have to be earmarked or specifically fundraised for? School has discussed benches or trees, also the passing of Ms. Manning. Loretta can speak to head of facilities for the school to discuss options and sourcing items that might be appropriate. Proposal to create a small sub committee for the council to pursue this. Caitlyn, Kate and Elise offer to be the subcommittee for the planning. Kate to take on setting up the meeting.



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Krista wondering if there are any ideas to use the PRO Grant for this year – applications are due Monday. Options for Indigenous speakers/presenters. Like the idea of the inclusivity. Discussions about various options for parent involvement committee. Is there a way to work to better support the new Arabic families in the school. One of the new teachers has been doing some translation for the Arabic families. Krista and Shannon will work together to try to get a PRO Grant application completed.

Spring Fling Committee – is there a need to set up a small committee to start planning and booking? Krista happy to chair that committee. Caitlyn to assist. Will poll other members or other parents who might be interested.
