Grades and Classes for 2017-2018

In all kindergarten classes, the students will be supported by the same two Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) regardless of the language of instruction. This helps the educators to become better acquainted with the children's needs and ensures consistency of practice and improves communication about students needs from day to day.

KINDERGARTEN & GRADE 1 PARENT-INFORMATION MEETING

If you missed the Grade 1 Information night last week, Grade 1 teachers were introduced. If SK parents have any questions about whether their child would do well in Grade 1 EFI, they are asked to please consult their current SK French teacher. Although teacher assignments can change over the summer, here is a summary of what is currently in place for the 2017-18 year. The 3 programs SK parents are able to choose from are:

1.) English Program

Teacher: Ms. Noble is teaching a Grade 1/2 class All day English, with 40min of Core French instruction

This program is best suited for students who have not mastered the English Language, do not like SK French this year, or who have trouble in stressful situations would be best here (i.e., not being able to speak English in EFI can be overwhelming for some)

2.) Early French Immersion (EFI)

Teacher: Mme Levitan is teaching both the Grade 1 EFI class, and the Grade 1/2 EFI class

All day French, with 60min of Math instruction in the English Language

Please note that English reading/writing is not taught in Grade 1, however most EFI students will reach the same reading level or higher than the English Programmed students by January of Grade 2. Statistics show that learning a 2nd language often improves your 1st language.

In Grades 2-6, EFI students receive all day French instruction, except for 60min of English and 60min of Math in English.

It is expected that students entering EFI do not have French-speaking parents at home so please don't worry about not being able to help your child. Similar to SK EFI, they will end up teaching you and that's half the fun!

3.) Middle French Immersion (MFI)

Begins in Grade 4



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This program is currently not offered at Jockvale, however you may feel this is the best option for your child if they need to currently focus on English instruction, but would like to be immersed in French when they're a bit older.

***Important to note that if you enroll your child in Grade 1 EFI, and they struggle, although not encouraged, you may choose to move them to the English Program. However, if you enroll them in English, they cannot move to EFI halfway through Grade 1. The only entry point for EFI is September of Grade 1.

GRADE 6 LEAVING CEREMONY

On Tuesday, June 27th, we will be recognizing our grade 6 students for their years spent at here at Jockvale. We will have a ceremony to bid them farewell and good luck on the next chapter in their life. We will be honouring the students with certificates and special awards at this time. The school will be providing students with a pizza lunch and cupcake for dessert in the library. Afterwards, the Gym will be set up for a Grade 6 dance (Paul Hill). Mrs. Sinclair's room will be set up for Grade 6 students who are unable to/do not wish to attend the dance.

BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

It was the 1st 3-on-3 tournament that our region has done and it went very smoothly. The canteens raised money for athletic equipment and the replacement of equipment. Regional tournaments have been run here for many years by Mrs. Sinclair. Coaches were Mr. Brynzcka, Mr. Long, Ms. Artelle, and Mme Phillips.

GIRLS CONFERENCE

The Elementary Teacher's Federation of Ontario (ETFO) ran a one day girls conference here at Jockvale 2 months ago. It was a wonderful day for many of our girls and girls from 2 other schools. Mrs. Ocquaye and Mrs. Sinclair were the school contacts on this. Girls will be meeting up again soon to revisit some of the themes covered during the conference. It was very inspiring.

Fundraising/Events Report

Movie Nights: The last movie night was May 26. There were two options Moana in the gym and Fantastic Beast and Where to Find Them in the library for grade 5 and 6 students. There was a low turnout for Moana and no one came to see Fantastic Beasts. The cost for the movie night was approximately \$188 and the profit was \$251.25. The left over cookies and granola bars, which will expire before the next council event in October were given to the school.

All of the movies purchased to show at movie nights this year (Secret Life of Pets, Storks, Zootopia, Sing, Monster Trucks and Moana) have been given to the school so teachers can sign them out to show to their class.



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Spring Fling: was held on Wednesday, June 7. There was a great turn out for the Spring Fling, including many families who had not attended before. Many people came into the school looking for where the activities were held so next year we should mention that the event takes place in the school yard. Comments from the Spring Fling have been positive and the food trucks seemed to well received. The only problem that was encountered was with Little Rays Reptiles. The staff member left at 5 saying she had only been booked for 1 hour and not 2, she did later return having realized her mistake but then left again promptly at 6. I complained to the company and they have offered to come to next year's spring fling for free. The email outlining this has been saved to the Google drive.

Staff Appreciation Lunch: Will be Thursday June 15. A description was included in the June council newsletter and will be communicated to parents through emails and Facebook. The council has enough plates, cutlery and napkins that can be used for the lunch. PRO Grant: We are submitting a grant proposal to have Marion Small do a presentation on the math curriculum in the fall. I would like to make a motion to reserve funds to pay for the information session so that we can reserve time in Marion's schedule now and we don't have to wait for approval of our grant proposal. I expect the grant proposal will be successful.

Food Programs:

Hot Dogs: No update. Joe may be able to state whether or not the new hot dog pot has been purchased.

Subway: Denise can provide an update on the proceeds from subway.

Lunch Lady: I received a statement from lunch lady, which states that the total raised through this lunch program from September 1, 2016 to May 31, 2017 is \$393.75. 4 cheques that were sent to the school from last school year and this year were accidental deposited into the school



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account for an amount of \$694.40. These funds are being returned to the school council. This means there is a total of \$816.90 in proceeds for lunch lady that will deposited into the school council account in June.

Should we consider hot lunches instead of lunch lady for 2017/2018 school year. Approximately 50 kids are using this program a week. There is another hot lunch program that is run out of Barrhaven. 1. Lower cost, 2. Nutritional value, 3. Convenience. 4. Low council involvement. Azra Temple to investigate over the summer.

Future ideas for Council

- Update Roles & responsibilities, standard operating procedures on the google drive.
- What went well and what didn't go well on fundraisers
- Involve the Grade 6 students more representative, maybe request them to present some ideas. Potential to pull this through leaders program. Keep them on the agenda first thing. Brings in a parent that may not be involved.
- Need a working group to spear head corporate sponsorship for larger asks. What is it that the school needs?
- Fundraising ideas: chocolate bars, book sale
- Online police checks can be done in 2hrs, if you provide a letter from organization saying you volunteer it is no charge. This should be brought to OCASC.
- In September, the board will come to the Council meeting to explain charitable status. Board should request time on the agenda.
- So you think you can dance Night! Program run by the school. In September the staff at the school will decide what programs they will take on. Grades 1 3 were included.
- Support the school to create the learning lab in the library. Potential for a corporate sponsorship.
